As the Sentinel went to press last month the Arizona Veteran's Affairs Task Force effort was just concluding and the FY2006 Defense Appropriations Bill was still emerging from a joint session of congress. So we spent our effort updating you on the efforts at the state level. This month we'll look at the national level.

Our national legislators finally finished work on the FY2006 Defense Bill in late December. Unfortunately, as MOAA has pointed out, the legislative glass for the year ended half full at best. The Senate failed to convince the House to correct the Survivor Benefit Program issues we had been fighting for all year (Eliminating the DIC offset to SBP payments and advancing the implementation date for 30-year paid up SBP from 2008), so we have work to do again in 2006 on those items.

On the brighter side several Guard/ Reserve issues we were working on were improved upon as were active duty pay, end strength and death benefits. An agreement was in hand to cap Medicare/TRICARE payments at 2005 levels rather than being reduced by 4.4% as the previous legislation required. Also, the VA received \$1.5B in additional funding and several initiatives to raise fees were headed off. You may view a corresponding list, Selected Legislative Goals for 2006, at the same site. Associated with those goals, one set of issues is already getting significant attention. The Department of Defense, supported by the Joint Chiefs of Staff, will propose in the FY2007

President's Budget that TRICARE fees for those military retirees under 65 be raised in some cases to double or triple what they now are. A corresponding proposal to increase pharmacy fees would affect not only Medicare-eligible military retirees, but also active duty/Guard/Reserve families as well. The exact details of the budget proposals will not be known until possibly early February when the President submits his budget to congress, and this may well just be the tip of the iceberg.

The Assistant Secretary of Defense (Health Affairs), Dr W. Winkenwerder, has already met with MOAA and other members of The Military Coalition on the subject. According to the government officials, retiree medical care costs, as well as other personnel costs, are keeping them from buying hardware, and the situation is becoming a readiness issue. We have been down this road before. Expect this to be a real "hot button" over the weeks ahead.

The year 2006 promises to be interesting and controversial, and we will need concerted effort from the veteran community to make it a successful one.

Personal Affairs by Bernie Conway

When was the last time you drove for 20-60 minutes to Luke, burned up a couple gallons of \$2.20-3.00 gas, sat in the pharmacy waiting room for 30-60 minutes, and when you finally got up to the window, found out they no longer carry the medicine you were trying to get? You then leave and stop at Walgreen's or CVS, and pay \$3.00, \$9.00 or \$22.00 for a 30 day supply.

YOU DON'T HAVE TO TAKE THIS ANYMORE!!

You can now order medicine from the comfort of your home, and usually have it in 2-3 days by utilizing the TRICARE Mail Order Pharmacy (TMOP) .You can fill your new prescriptions by mail, and can order refills by mail, phone, or via the computer, and you can order a 90 day supply for the same co-pay of a 30 day supply at a retail pharmacy, and I have not found a medicine they do not have, or will clear a suitable substitute with your doctor. This system is only worthwhile for ongoing medication usually written with a 90 day supply with 3 refills. With one time prescriptions for a toothache or a virus, you are better off fighting the pharmacy, or going right to the local drug store

Co-pay for a 90 day supply is \$3.00 for generic drugs, \$9.00 for non-generic drugs, and \$22.00 for what are called non-formulary drugs. Examples of these are Nexium, Teveten, and Teveten HCT and Viagra. These are drugs that DOD feels a less expensive suitable substitute is available. Your doctor can submit evidence of medical necessity for the specific drug, and if approved, it will still be the \$9.00 co-pay.

DO I HAVE YOUR ATTENTION YET?

To get started with this program, you can log on EXPRESS-SCRIPTS.com, or call Express-Scripts at 866-363-8667, play push button tag to get the correct option, and they will mail you an order form, or pick up a form at the Luke pharmacy. You can also write to Express Scripts, P.O. Box 52150, Phoenix, AZ 85072 to get the form, but that is the old fashioned way, takes longer, and costs \$.37. There are 13 pages of information on the Express-Scripts.com website that may tell you more than you really want to know about this program. Maybe I have already told you more than you want to know about this program!

If you need this info, and are not comfortable with the computer world, give me a call at 480-994-0440, and I will make a copy of the instructions and will get them to you. It is best to get the paperwork you picked up at the Pharmacy, or requested by phone or mail submitted to the system prior to needing the medicine. They supply you with a postage paid envelope with their application form and information pack. It will make the turn around time for your first prescription much shorter.

DOD Restricts On-Base Cell Phone Use

Defense Department installations have begun implementing new cell phone restrictions for drivers on military bases. The regulation states that anyone driving a motor vehicle on a DOD installation cannot use a cell phone unless the vehicle is safely parked or the driver is using a hands-free device. Many installations have already implemented the new restrictions, and the rest will implement the rules on their own schedule. This regulation is a minimum requirement, and installation commanders still have the authority to put stricter rules in place. Each installation will determine the punishment for violation of the rules.




