

Paul Schnur, MD & Barbara Schnur, RN, BSN



Paul graduated from the University of Arizona and obtained his MD from Baylor University College of Medicine. He completed his residency at the Mayo Clinic in Minnesota. Paul practiced medicine in Sedona and was a consultant in the Verde Valley until his retirement. He was on active duty, US Army Medical Corps, in Germany, 1964-1966 and is currently an Associate Professor at the University of Arizona and the Mayo Medical School. Dr. Schnur is an Arizona Veterans Hall of Fame member, and he and his wife Barbara will be presenting a video honoring the people of Mayo Clinic who served with distinction to support America's armed forces. Barbara obtained her RN from the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania, in Philadelphia, and her BSN from Duke University in Durham, NC. She worked at Texas Children's Hospital and the Methodist Hospital in Houston, Texas, and met her future husband, Paul Schnur, a medical student at Baylor.
