Officer Jennifer Eastman has been with the Phoenix Police Department for over 17 years. She has held previous assignments in Patrol, serving as a Patrol Officer and a Community Action Officer. She also has been a former coordinator for Phoenix Neighborhood Patrol and Block Watch programs at the citywide level. She was assigned as an officer in the Public Affairs Bureau for seven years and contributed greatly in enhancing the department's web-site and social media capabilities. Officer Eastman is currently assigned to the Community Relations Bureau where she focuses on Community Engagement and Outreach efforts. Officer Eastman coordinates the Citizens Police Academy, the "Behind the Badge", and the "Cop for a Day" programs. Prior to being hired by the City of Phoenix, Officer Eastman served in the United States Army and the Arizona Army National Guard. She holds a Masters of Science Degree in Leadership from Grand Canyon University.



**In the year 2015, the Phoenix Police Communications Bureau answered over 2.3 million incoming calls, which averages out to just below 6,400 calls per day. The centers answer emergency calls for service on 9-1-1 lines, as well as calls on the City of Phoenix Non-Emergency line, called Crime Stop, at (602) 262-6151.
