Here's a little information about chapter This is important, ladies and membership now. gentlemen. Every member in a MOAA chapter must be a member in good standing with national MOAA, and that includes payment of dues. For our LIFE

members, you pay once and your national MOAA dues are paid up for life. If you're a PREMIUM member (another term for 'annual member'), you have to pay dues to MOAA annually. Last, if you're a BASIC member, there are no dues payments to MOAA – but – you have to be registered with them. With any class of membership, you'll be given a member number. The type/level of membership you choose will probably be determined by the MOAA benefits you want. If you are/were a LIFE or PREMIUM member but you don't need that level any more, you can easily switch to BASIC (no cost). If you need assistance, please contact MOAA member services or me. Here's a link to take you directly to the MOAA membership page.

Please check your MOAA 'Profile', too. Many of us have moved or changed contact information, and that should be updated. Lastly, we have members who have checked the box on their MOAA profile stating they didn't want any telephone or email contact from MOAA. Well, that includes us, your friendly chapter. Please be sure to review that and check the appropriate selection.



"Keeping the Faith in Difficult Times" Paula Pedene

Inspirational Speaker and Award Winning Author



In 2014, Paula worked with Dr. Sam Foote to blow the whistle on the agency for fraudulently fudging patient waiting lists to make it appear that vets were being seen within the required time frame. The scandal led to the resignation of several VA officials, including the department's cabinet secretary Eric Shinseki.

An internal investigation at the Phoenix VA found that 40 veterans had died while waiting for care, but a 2016 investigation by the Office of the Inspector General at the Department of Veterans Affairs found at least 200 cases of veterans dying while waiting for care.

Pedene's book, A Sacred Duty: How a Whistleblower Took on the VA and Won, details how she discovered the agency's practice of maintaining multiple waiting lists to hide actual wait times, her attempts to report it to authorities within the VA, and the retaliation she faced from higher-ups.

Legislative Update

Congress Running Out of Time - Shutdown Looms Again

he government is currently running on a Continuing Resolution (CR) budget deal that expires November 14 – less than three weeks from now. Three weeks were lost in finding a new Speaker of the House, but now we have one and time is short. Lawmakers still have to pass 12 appropriations bills to fund the government for the rest of FY 2024 – or pass yet another CR. What a way to run a railroad!

MOAA has long pressed the need to end this crippling cycle of continuing resolutions – to fully fund the government before the end of the fiscal year, and to eliminate yet another source of stress and instability from the lives of those in uniform, and of their family members. These pleas have fallen on deaf ears.

Put bluntly, actions like these damage our national security. Not just because a shutdown would disrupt key services, or because the lack of a full budget means new, innovative programs remain stalled while old, outdated processes move forward. The real threat doesn't come from the balance sheet – it comes from the lack of respect shown toward those who serve from the individuals who are proud to "support our troops."

This dysfunctional behavior comes as the uniformed services face unprecedented recruiting challenges. Even as some in Congress attempt to

address recent reports of horrific barracks conditions, the overall message sent by lawmakers is unmistakable – do not expect us to prioritize the care of those willing to sacrifice everything on behalf of our nation.

How does a recruiter make any headway with that message in the headlines? How can military retirees be expected to encourage the service of future servicemembers when evidence suggests those potential recruits will not have the full support of their government?

MOAA has long worked to ensure the benefits of all who serve – all ranks, all branches – and their families and survivors. That's why we want to encourage our members to do what lawmakers seemingly cannot – keep the budget fight in the spotlight, even when a funding deadline isn't right around the corner.

Send a message to your legislators via MOAA's Legislative Action Center today. Tell them the budget brinksmanship needs to stop – not just to keep the lights on, but to maintain the trust of servicemembers, veterans and military families who make up the backbone of the all-volunteer force. It's a simple step to show Congress truly "supports our troops."

2024 FEDVIP Plans and Premiums Announced Ahead of Open Season

he average dental and vision plans under the Federal Employee Dental and Vision Insurance Program (FEDVIP) will see small increases in 2024, according to the Office of Personnel Management (OPM), which recently announced and posted the plans and premiums.

OPM manages the health, dental and vision insurance programs for federal civilian employees. Military retirees, and their beneficiaries, enrolled in TRICARE have been eligible to utilize FEDVIP programs since 2019.

The 2024 average monthly dental premium will increase by 1.4%, and vision premiums by 1.1%. FEDVIP features 12 dental plan providers and five vision plan providers.

All but one dental provider offers both "standard" and "high" plan options. Standard plans have lower monthly premiums (usually half of the high option) but higher co-pays. As a rule, the standard plan is probably best if you and/or your family have good oral health,

but a high plan may be best if you and/or your family have poor oral health or orthodonture needs. The major difference between standard and high vision plans is the yearly frame/lens allowance. Plan premium rates are based on where you live.

Some notable changes to next year's plans:

- Seven of the 12 dental carriers added coverage for the use of nitrous oxide when medically necessary.
- Two of the five vision carriers increased the frame allowance dollar amount.

Even if you are satisfied with your current plan, it never hurts to conduct a yearly comparison of FEDVIP plans. The <u>BENEFEDS Plan Comparison Tool</u> will have both 2023 and 2024 pricing available for comparison.

The 2024 TRICARE and FEDVIP open season begins November 13, 2023, and concludes December 11 at midnight. Changes to your dental and vision coverage take effect January 1, 2024.

MOAA strongly recommends comparing next year's pricing with this year's premium to ensure you are satisfied with your dental and/or vision plan. If you take no action during the open season, you will be automatically "rolled over" to the same plan with new pricing next year. Get more FEDVIP information at BENEFEDS.com.




