Key to Efficiency Efforts Is Not Breaking Faith with Troops, Veterans

OAA outlined several key areas of concern "to our members and our nation" amid ongoing government efficiency work, pledging to use "all available resources" to ensure promises made to those who serve and have served, as well as their families and survivors, are kept.

Those top priorities, as outlined in a recent press release:

• **PROTECT** the value of service-earned health benefits from new TRICARE fees, disproportionate TRICARE cost-share increases, or barriers to accessing care in the Military Health System or through the VA.

• *PRESERVE* the pay earned by those in uniform, including scheduled pay increases and established concurrent receipt provisions and eligibility.

• *PREVENT* burdensome delays in VA claims processing and/or reduction of earned VA benefits.

• **DEFEND** the veterans and military spouses who continue their service in the federal government — and other federal employees who serve veterans.





MOAA called the work to find efficiencies in government "not only appropriate, but necessary" given mounting debt and other fiscal challenges. However, "without thorough review and implementation, our nation risks breaking promise and faith with the wider military and veteran community — a risk that weakens our national defense for generations," the release states.

MOAA outlined other avenues for "responsible defense budget reform" in a previous statement, including greater efficiency in program management and acquisition, along with an overall budget strategy designed to limit "hasty cuts" in favor of long-term stability.

Ongoing Advocacy

The April 8th release came as MOAA members and staff made final preparations to visit congressional offices as part of Advocacy in Action (AiA), MOAA's signature spring advocacy event. The AiA event, April 9th, addressed <u>specific</u> <u>benefits issues</u> ranging from health care access to spouse unemployment to caregiver concerns; visit MOAA's <u>Legislative Action Center</u> to make your voice heard on these topics.

Why Now Is the Perfect Time to Kick Off Next Year's Tax Planning

E ach spring, many of us breathe a sigh of relief when we finish gathering documents and filing our federal income tax return. But after a brief pause, it's time to head back to the computer — while your tax return is fresh in your mind, and do the following:

Understand Your Return

Many people only take notice of two things on their Form 1040: If they have a refund (line 34) or if they owe tax (line 37). But there's a bit more to it than that. If you have a large refund, that means you overpaid your taxes — giving Uncle Sam an interestfree loan — and you should think about withholding less in taxes for next year.

If you owe a lot in taxes, you might be subject to a penalty, and you should consider withholding more in taxes. If you owe too much when you file your return, the IRS will require you to make quarterly tax payments for the next tax year.

Another item to note is your adjusted gross income, or AGI (line 11). Reducing this amount reduces your tax liability. Owners of traditional IRA's can consider converting some funds to Roth IRAs to reduce future taxes. Or make Qualified Charitable Deductions (QCD's) from the Required Minimum Deductions (RMD's) of your traditional IRA.

Tax moves that lower your AGI can also help mitigate getting an Income-Related Monthly Adjustment Amount added to your Medicare Part B premium.

Adjust Withholding

The IRS has a <u>Tax Withholding Estimator</u> that can help you figure out how much tax you want your employer to withhold from your pay. Retirees can also use the calculator to enter pension income or Social Security benefits and then receive an estimate of their projected tax liability and withholding.

out IRS Form W-4, <u>Employee's Withholding</u> <u>Certificate</u>, and give it to your employer, if you are still working. To withhold tax on your Social Security benefits, submit <u>IRS Form W-4V</u> to the Social Security Administration; learn more <u>at this</u> <u>link</u>.

Military retirees can submit their W-4 to the Defense Finance and Accounting Service by mail or fax or by using their myPay online account. Annuitants use a W-4P form; get details here.

Retirees who have the Coast Guard Pay & Personnel Center as their pay agency can change their tax information via Direct Access or by emailing their W-4 to <u>ppc-dg-customercare@uscg.mil</u>.

It's tempting to file away your return and put it out of mind, but taking a few moments to review your tax return submitted this year can better prepare you for next year.
